As well as being Northern Ireland's treasure house of the past and present, Ulster Museum hosts a dynamic and diverse programme of temporary exhibitions. Two of those exhibitions for 2022-23 include...

ANYTHING GOES: 1920S FASHION | OCTOBER 2022 TO DECEMBER 2023

This exhibition will explore the exuberance and freedom of the 1920s through its fashions. 'Anything Goes!' will present the key trends of the 1920s and examine their origins, such as the "Egyptomania" prompted by the discovery of the tomb of King

Tutankhamon, and the exoticism of the Ballet Russes. Several of the objects selected have rarely or never been displayed before, and new research now indicates that one of the key pieces, a beautiful embroidered opera cloak, may have been made by the Russian avant-garde artist Natalia Goncharova.



INCLUSIVE GLOBAL HISTORIES | March 2022 to December 2023

Inclusive Global Histories is a new exhibition demonstrating National Museums NI's commitment to decolonisation, diversity and inclusion. The exhibition highlights how we are re-evaluating our World Cultures collection to



better understand the complex global stories of some 4,500 items - how and why they came to be in Belfast, how they can be connected to audiences and what the options might be for their future. It's also part of our programme to mark Ulster Museum's 50th anniversary this year.

ULSTER FOLK MUSEUM



First opened in 1964, the Ulster Folk Museum is a remarkable living museum and environmental resource situated at Cultra, three miles outside of Belfast. Refresh the connection and rediscover Ulster as it was over a century ago in a place that actively preserves and demonstrates traditions, stories and skills passed down through many generations of people in Ulster. The authentic, heritage buildings that make up 'Ballycultra Town' - an old-time picture house, post office, corner shop, bank and churches to name but a few - as well as the farmhouse, workshops and cottages that are dotted throughout 150 acres of countryside, were all transported from original locations from around Ulster and rebuilt one by one on our site.

Explore the rural working farm with crops and farm animals, meet the costumed characters who keep the rich stories of our past alive and watch the craft demonstrators who still practice centuries old traditions and crafts that Ulster is famous for.

CULTRA MANOR TOUR

Built in 1902, this Manor House has had a magnificent history. Belonging to the Kennedy family (of President Kennedy descent), it was built for Sir Robert and Lady Kennedy to enjoy their retirement. Taking up residence in 1912, the house served as a family home for the Kennedys and their four daughters.

ULSTER TRANSPORT MUSEUM



The Ulster Transport Museum is home to the only comprehensive transport collection on the island of Ireland, which covers all major types of transport and includes vehicles, artefacts, photographic and archival material, dating primarily from the mid-19th century to the late 20th century. From iconic Irish railcars, Belfast trams and historical ships to autogyros and the world-famous DeLorean, you'll discover the stories of the people and machines that embody Northern Ireland's long tradition of innovation and engineering excellence. It's a special place to inspire innovation, where technical endeavour and innovation meet human courage and achievement.

Explore stories of expansive networks, speed and mobility, pioneering voyages, invention, everyday life and extraordinary daring. You'll see *RMS Titanic* objects that were recovered from the icy Atlantic, trains and trams shipyard workers would have travelled on to the Harland & Wolff Shipyard. There's the 'Museum of Innovation' which showcases the most innovative objects from our collections - from the first portable defibrillator, how the Short brothers began their career in aviation and how Harry Ferguson revolutionised agriculture across the globe. And the museum's newest exhibition 'Celtic Wave', exploring the history of surfing in Ireland.

MUSEUM OF INNOVATION | NEW PERMANENT EXHIBITION

This exhibition showcases objects from our collections and how their inventors have contributed in some way to Northern Ireland's long and illustrious legacy of innovation. Explore the stories behind the development of the first portable defibrillator and how the Short brothers began their career in aviation.

Learn how Harry Ferguson revolutionised agriculture, all across the world, through his invention of the 3-point linkage and find out more about the origins of the infamous DeLorean DMC-12 car.

As well as learning more about the personal stories of achievement and advancement associated with the objects on display, you can discover how these innovations are relevant to the engineers and scientists of the future.

ULSTER AMERICAN FOLK PARK



Established in 1976, Ulster American Folk Park tells the story of Irish emigration to North America over two centuries. The Park is set over 60 acres, comprising of over 30 original buildings lovingly moved and restored in situ to create the **journey back in time** from the thatched cottages of Ulster to the log cabins of the American Frontier, including a full-size replica of a migrant ship marking the crossing between the Old and New Worlds. The Park was originally developed around the Mellon House, the birthplace of Thomas Mellon, the founding father of the Mellon banking dynasty. Experience costumed guides and live interpretation across the site including demonstrations of heritage crafts skills such as linen weaving, blacksmithing, candlemaking, printing and open-hearth cooking.

There's also the brand new 'Bad Bridget' exhibition that opened early 2022, which represents the beginning of a new experience for visitors to the Folk Park, as traditionally, women's stories have been underrepresented here even though women accounted for around half of Irish migrants from 1800 onwards. A full sensory experience, 'Bad Bridget' highlights the adversities many women and girls faced when they migrated to North America from Ireland in the 19th and early 20th centuries.

NEW EXHIBITIONS

BAD BRIDGET

The Bad Bridget exhibition tells the stories of thousands of women who left Ireland for North America between 1838 and 1918. Some of these women found themselves in trouble with the authorities as they struggled to survive.





Using an eclectic mix of objects, sights, sounds and smells, the exhibition charts these women's experiences of migration; starting with their lives in Ireland and the hardships that led many to migrate.

The exhibition provides an insight into life at sea which was often difficult and dangerous. Having eventually arrived, America came as a shock to most of the women. Living in poverty and bombarded by temptations, crime never seemed far away. The exhibition shines a light on their living conditions in the tenements and the treatment they received from the authorities.
